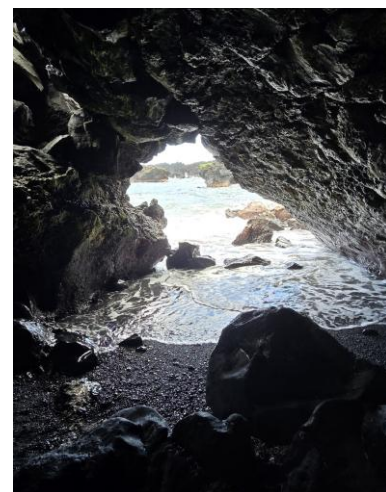

Itinerary

Tuesday, January 19, 2027

Start your day early as you board the motorcoach for a journey to MSP Airport. From there, we'll catch our flight to Hawaii, the vacation you've always dreamed of! We'll spend the night in the beautiful Waikiki Beach area of Oahu.

Wednesday, January 20, 2027

This morning we go snorkeling at Hanauma Bay! Here we will be able to see many species of fish that live in the coral reef in Hanauma Bay. Kind of like a real life "Finding Nemo!" This afternoon is free to enjoy Waikiki! Overnight Waikiki. (B)



Thursday, January 21, 2027

Early this morning we take a short flight to the Big Island of Hawaii. While there we will take an island tour that includes the Volcanoes National Park, home to Kilauea, one of the world's most active volcanoes. We visit Rainbow Falls, and discover other various scenic spots around Hilo, and within the national park. This evening we fly back to Oahu where we spend the night. Overnight Waikiki. (B)

Friday, January 22, 2027

"December 7, 1941.... a day that lives in infamy" a quote from Franklin D. Roosevelt, the day Pearl Harbor was attacked. We visit the USS Arizona where more than 900 sailors are still entombed today. Stand in the place where Japan surrendered to the US on September 2nd 1945 on the USS Missouri. Hickam Airfield still has bullet holes in the hangar from that day. All three of those sites, plus the Bowfin Submarine and a city tour are included in today's activities. (The Pearl Harbor boat tour to the USS Arizona is based upon availability. The tour is controlled by the National Park Service and will not grant tickets until one week prior to the tour, with a limited amount allowed per day) Overnight Waikiki. (B)



Saturday, January 23, 2027



Today's tour includes a tour of the island of Oahu. We board the motorcoach and make our way to the Dole Plantation, where you can purchase some of that famous Dole Whip Ice Cream! On Oahu's North Shore are some of the biggest waves for surfers to compete on. The North Shore is famous for its powerful waves, particularly during the winter months (October to April) when swells can reach 30 feet or more. We pay a visit to a local store where you can buy some of those Hawaii shirts and dresses that you wanted to purchase. Have we been in the sun long enough by now that maybe we will start to look not so much like tourists? Our afternoon concludes with a stop at the Polynesian Cultural Center where we learn about 6 different Polynesian Island cultures. As we step inside the gates of the Polynesian Cultural Center, we enter a world of discovery and adventure. As we visit each village, immerse yourself in their distinct and beautiful culture. Meet the people, taste the food, play, sing and dance. You will watch cultural presentations for each island, practice hula dancing, tiki stick games, weave palm fronds, make fires, learn about poi weapons, and create tattoos. Included with our stay is a Buffet supper followed by their performance of the show, "HA...Breath of Life." The symbolic story of Mana and his beloved Lani, punctuated by Polynesian dance, music and blazing fire knives, is told in "HĀ: Breath of Life," this stunning evening show featuring Pacific Islanders, special effects, animation and surround sound. It is a Pacific Isle saga of birth and death, love and family, tragedy and triumph. After the show we make our way back to Waikiki to our hotel. Overnight Waikiki. (B, S)

Sunday, January 24, 2027

As we start our slowed down portion of your tour to Hawaii, we fly over to Maui early this afternoon and get checked in to our resort on Kaanapali Beach on Maui's west side in the town of Lahaina. Overnight Lahaina. (B)

Monday, January 25, 2027

Enjoy the reason why we came from Minnesota in January, to Hawaii today. Spend time on the beach, walk to Whalers Village to browse through some of the shops and restaurants, or just hang out on the beach, or your balcony, and look for whales out in the ocean today. Our resort has many daily activities for you to participate in such as: taking a tour of their gardens, making a lei, bamboo stamp making, learning the Hawaiian language, Hawaiian dance, and ocean navigation. Overnight Lahaina. (B)

Tuesday, January 26, 2027

Maui has a road that is 64 miles long, has over 600 curves and 59 bridges. This is called the Road to Hana. Today we travel that road and enjoy many stops along the way. We drive through a rainforest, see Rainbow Eucalyptus trees, numerous waterfalls and photo stops along the way. Visit the Waianapanapa State Park and the Black Sand Beach along with various roadside stands. Lunch will be included today. As we drive the road to Hana we have many excellent ocean, cliff and coastal views (you will be glad you are a passenger and can take in all of the scenery along this road.) Our local guide will narrate along the way and take us to some of the local favorite stops. This evening enjoy an included evening meal at the world famous Mama's Fish House Restaurant! Overnight Lahaina. (B,D,S)

**Wednesday, January 27, 2027**

Enjoy a day at our resort soaking up the sun. Feel free to take in an activity or two that our resort offers during our stay. Overnight Lahaina. (B)

Thursday, January 28, 2027

Whaler's Village is a short walk from our resort or you can spend time just enjoying the views and the fact that it is not Minnesota temperatures and climate in January! During one of the days in Maui we will tour the Maui Chocolate Farm

where we learn about the production and harvesting of cacao, and then turning it into chocolate. We learn about the many varieties of cacao and how each one produces its own distinct flavor in the chocolate. This evening we enjoy an included luau at the Old Lahaina Luau right in downtown Lahaina. Overnight Lahaina. (B,S)

Friday, January 29, 2027

As our vacation is drawing to a close, we spend one last day of sun and relaxation at our resort in Lahaina. Overnight Lahaina. (B)

Saturday, January 30, 2027

Our final island tour will be at Maui Gold Pineapple Farm where we get into the pineapple fields and taste some of the world's best, sweetest pineapple. Learn about the growth and production of pineapple and you will get a pineapple to bring back home in an airline approved box and take on the plane as a carry on. It's time to say "Aloha" as we depart the Hawaiian Islands and take a red eye flight back to Minneapolis. (B)

Sunday, January 31, 2027

We land in Minneapolis early morning (like breakfast time) and a motorcoach will be waiting to take us back to Appleton. We hope you enjoyed your time in the sun.

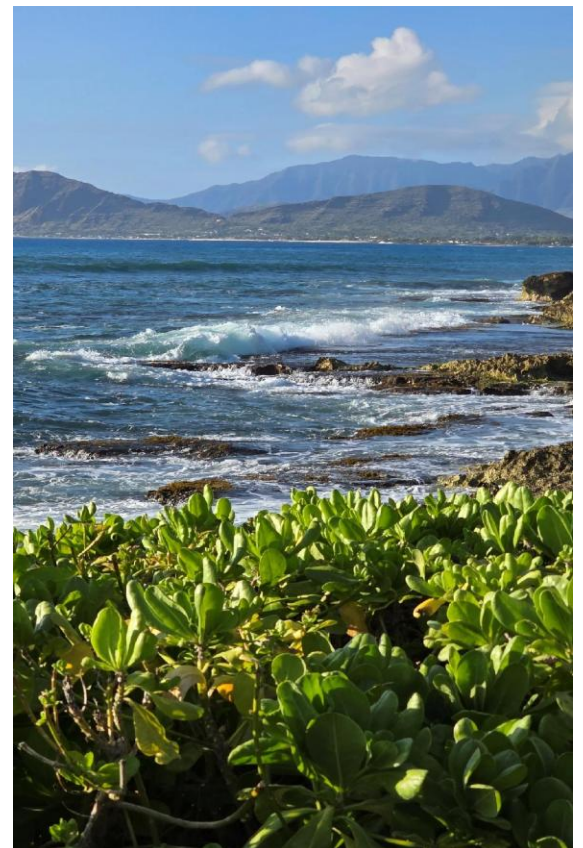

Notes For Our Travelers Regarding The Type Of License Needed to Fly To Hawaii

Do you need to bring your passport?

Maybe.. depending on the kind of driver's license you have.

You need to have a MN Real ID or Enhanced Drivers license to fly. If you do not have that, then you need to bring your passport.

Here are a few examples. The top one is a regular MN Driver's license which DOES NOT work for flying

. The real ID has the gold star in the top Right hand corner.

This one works to fly.

The last one on the bottom left is the Enhanced Drivers License. This one also works

to fly. If you do not have either one of these licenses then you need to bring your passport to fly. Make sense? If you do not have any of these forms of identification please contact Wes or Karen ASAP so we can make arrangements.



Just a reminder to check on purchasing trip insurance. Some companies like Allianz offer some affordable annual policies that are often as cheap or cheaper than one policy to cover a expensive tour like Alaska or Hawaii. Each company has their quirks and little fine print about deadlines etc. So read it over carefully, but we encourage everyone to buy trip insurance.
